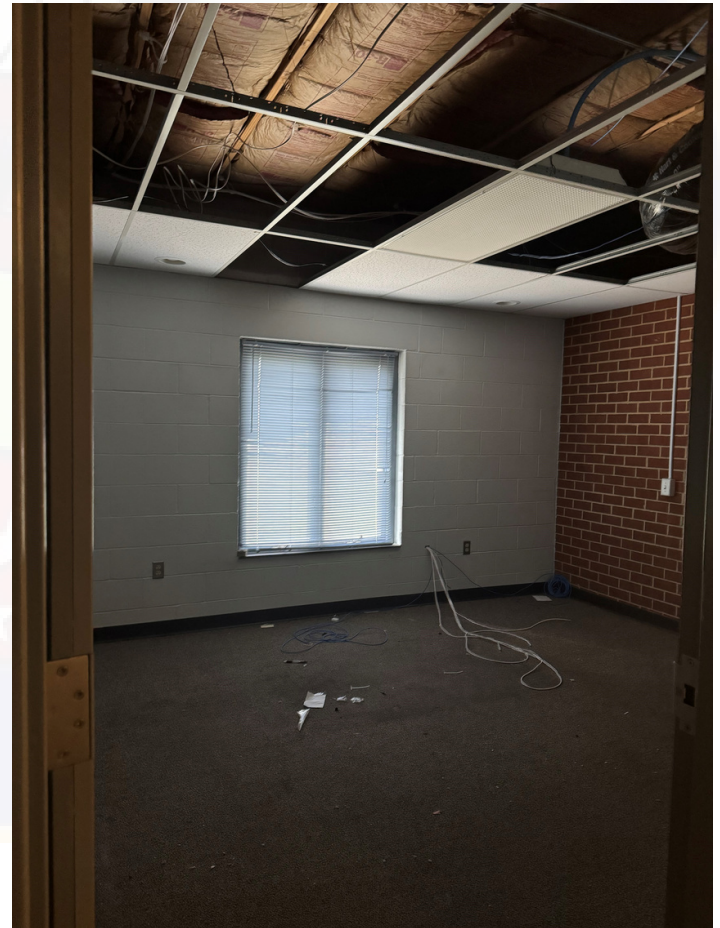

Springing the Township Forward

As Spring and warm weather comes to Cumberland Township we continue to Spring forward with projects in our Township.

Bids for the Building Renovation Project were received and evaluated. The Board of Supervisors took action to approve and move forward with this valuable Community project. Notice of Intent to award notifications have been distributed to:

- ECI Construction LLC - General Construction Contract
- Mann Plumbing and Heating, LLC - HVAC Construction Contract
- Stouffer Mechanical Contractor LLC - Plumbing Construction Contract
- Hull's Electrical Service Inc. - Electrical Construction Contract

As the Building Renovation project moves forward the Township will move forward to assemble a Park and Recreation Comprehensive Plan for consideration. Funding for this project was made possible and awarded from two grants the Township received.

- \$40,000 awarded from the Department of Conservation and Natural Resources (DCNR) Community Conservation Partnership Program (C2P2)
- \$40,000 awarded from the PA Department of Community & Economic Development (DCED) Greenways, Trails, and Recreation Program (GTRP).

The Township has completed its Annual Financial Audit for 2024 and received its Financial Report (DCED-CLGS-30) from SEK. The entire Township team once again had no issues or concerns. The Township also completed its Pennsylvania Liquid Fuels Tax Fund Audit with the same results.

I continue to handle all of the subdivision and land development plans along with all Board hearings in addition to all human resource items for employees, keeper of all records for the Township and serve as the Board Secretary for meetings. I enjoy working with all of the employees with this position and that every day there is something new, you never know what the day may bring.

From your Maintenance Department...



Happy Spring!

The spring and summer seasons in the Cumberland Township Maintenance Department are a busy time of year for planned maintenance routines and projects.

Street sweeping and anti-skid clean-up will be taking place in late March. This process helps reduce the road sediment from the winter snow removal process that can get into storm sewer facilities. We work in cooperation with Gettysburg Borough and their street sweeper, along with equipment from our own department to haul materials to the designated stockpiles.

Also, an important task during the spring will be to clear any trees, limbs or other vegetation from obstructing visibility of signs and sight distances in or around intersections.

Starting this season, we will be cutting shoulders in preparation for various road projects throughout the Township. This is the first step in the seal coating process, which will follow later this summer. This process allows for the soil and sediment that has built up along the shoulder of the road and in the ditch line to be removed so rainwater can be directed to flow off the roadway and into proper channels. This is an important maintenance procedure to help preserve the roadways from damaging rain and water.

Roadside mowing will continue throughout the growing season. This is an everyday, ongoing practice throughout the Township. The tractor travels at very slow speed and the operator has multiple responsibilities while mowing, please stay back from the mower and approach with caution.

We have numerous planned projects this season! Those projects include paving, seal coating and cape seals along with pipe replacements and base repair work in preparation for the continued strengthening of our Township's infrastructure. Keep reading to meet another vital teammate in our constant endeavor to keep our Township in tip-top shape!

What is one project or accomplishment you're particularly proud of?

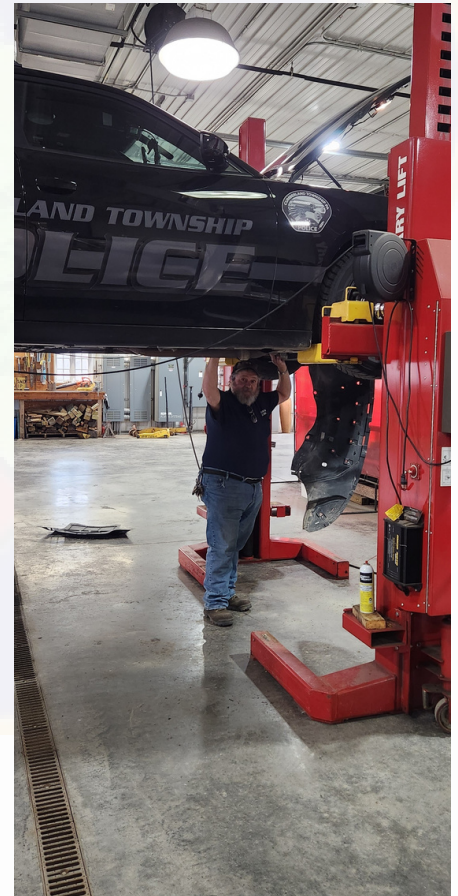
- ★ There is no one single thing, I take pride in everything I do!

Oak Lawn Update

Navigating the process of burials, plot sales, and ownership transfers at Oak Lawn Cemetery can seem overwhelming. To assist families, funeral directors, and plot owners, we have compiled the following guidelines to ensure a smooth and respectful process.

Conducting a Burial at Oak Lawn Cemetery

- Contact Ben Smyers – Ben is contracted with Adams County and has access to Oak Lawn Cemetery records. He can assist in researching burial locations and ownership details.

Selling a Burial Plot or Other Deeded Assets

- Consult a licensed real estate attorney – A legal professional will ensure that the transaction is handled correctly and in compliance with relevant regulations.

Transferring a Burial Plot or Deeded Asset

- Engage a licensed real estate attorney – They can guide you through the legal transfer process to ensure proper documentation and legitimacy.

Other Cemetery-Related Inquiries

- Consult a licensed real estate attorney for legal matters.
- Reach out to a funeral director for guidance on burial arrangements and related services.

Requesting Oak Lawn Cemetery Records

- Head to our website - www.cumberlandtwppa.gov
- Select “Oak Lawn” from the blue bar across the top of the website.
- Follow directions on the form and submit to oaklawn@cumberlandtwppa.gov
- You can also pick up a Records Request Form from the township office.

Let's Talk Storm Water!

Preparing Your Lawn & Garden for Spring

As the snow melts and temperatures rise, it's time to roll up your sleeves and get your lawn and garden ready for the warmer months ahead. By incorporating eco-friendly practices into your spring preparations, you can create a thriving outdoor space while protecting our waterways from stormwater pollution. Here are some simple tips to ensure your lawn and garden are both beautiful and environmentally friendly this spring.

Use Organic Fertilizers

Fertilizers help your lawn and garden grow, but traditional chemical fertilizers can contribute to stormwater pollution. When rain washes excess fertilizers off your property, they often end up in local waterways, causing nutrient pollution and harmful algae blooms. Instead, opt for organic fertilizers made from natural materials like compost or bone meal. They're not only better for the environment but also enrich your soil over time.

Avoid Overwatering

Overwatering can lead to excess runoff, which carries soil, fertilizers, and pesticides into storm drains and eventually into local rivers and streams. To prevent this, water your lawn and garden early in the morning or late in the afternoon to minimize evaporation. Use soaker hoses or drip irrigation systems to deliver water directly to the roots where it's needed most. A good rule of thumb is to provide about one inch of water per week, including rainfall.

Aerate Your Lawn

Compacted soil can prevent water from soaking into the ground, increasing the risk of runoff. Aerating your lawn in the spring helps improve soil structure, allowing water and nutrients to reach plant roots more effectively. You can rent an aerator or hire a professional lawn care service for this task.

Plant Native Species

Native plants are perfectly adapted to your local climate and soil conditions, making them a low-maintenance and eco-friendly choice. They typically require less water, fertilizer, and pesticides, reducing the risk of harmful runoff into storm drains. Additionally, native plants provide essential habitats for pollinators like bees and butterflies, helping to support biodiversity in your area.

Use Mulch

Adding a layer of mulch around your plants and in garden beds can help retain soil moisture, reduce the need for watering, and prevent erosion. Organic mulch, such as wood chips or straw, breaks down over time, improving soil health and providing nutrients for your plants.

Dispose of Yard Waste Properly

When cleaning up leaves, branches, and other yard debris, avoid sweeping them into storm drains. Instead, compost your yard waste or use it as mulch.

By following these eco-friendly lawn and garden care tips, you can enjoy a lush, vibrant outdoor space this spring while helping to protect our environment. Every small action adds up to make a big difference for our local waterways and community. Let's work together to keep our stormwater systems clean and effective!

A Message from the PA Department of Agriculture



Pennsylvania Urban Nutrient Management - Spring Greening

Spring to Life

As the snow slowly melts away, the birds begin to sing and fresh life bursts from the soil heralding the approach of Spring and the lawn maintenance season.

For the 1 million-plus acres of home lawns in Pennsylvania, selecting and implementing an appropriate lawncare management program to promote healthy and aesthetically pleasing lawns is not only important to homeowners, but is also essential to protecting our waterways.

Soil Health. It's the bottom line.

Maintaining a happy, healthy soil is imperative to your lawn's success. Soil is the foundation for your lawn and is home to a multitude of microorganisms that are essential for plant growth. Take the time to support your soil by incorporating some simple practices into your lawn care program. Your lawn and wallet will thank you.

- **Keep it open.** Routine soil aeration can help reduce soil compaction. Good soil structure is essential for proper root growth, healthy microbe communities, and the movement and exchange of water, air, and nutrients.
- **Raise it up.** Maintain a taller lawn by only cutting 1/3 of the grass blade with each mowing. Taller lawns slow runoff and promote deeper roots, which reduces lawn stress and improves soil structure.
- **Put it back.** Return nutrients and organic matter back to the soil by mulching your leaves and grass clippings.

For more soil management strategies, contact your local county conservation district or Penn State Extension office.

Know What's Best. Soil Test!

The first step to understanding what your lawn really needs to be lush, healthy, and green is to know what your soil needs. It is important to conduct regular soil tests to determine nutrient deficiencies that should guide fertilizer selection and application. Soil test kits can be purchased for a nominal fee from your local Penn State Extension office.

Following soil test recommendations, reading fertilizer label instructions, and using a properly calibrated spreader will ensure the right amount of nitrogen, phosphorus, and potassium are applied, while reducing nutrient loss and fertilizer cost.



Pennsylvania Urban Nutrient Management - Spring Greening

Green Lawns – Clean Streams

Pennsylvania's 2022 Fertilizer Law amendments were developed to protect Pennsylvania waterways and the waterways downstream. As a bonus, following the limitations in the law will boost your bottom line by ensuring that your investment doesn't wash away. The 2022 law established the following nitrogen and phosphorus limits for turf fertilizer applications.

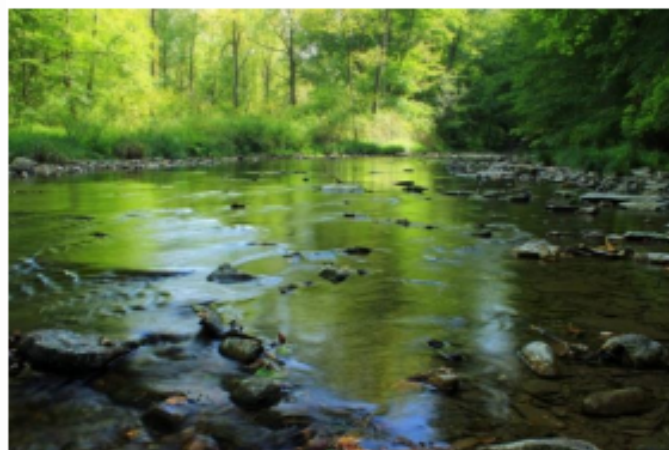
- Nitrogen is limited to 0.9 pounds of total nitrogen and 0.7 pounds of available nitrogen per 1000 ft² per application.
- No phosphorus can be applied unless establishing or repairing turf.
- Nitrogen and phosphorus rates can be adjusted based on soil test recommendations and/or if using an enhanced-efficiency fertilizer.

In addition to the nutrient limitations, the law also established application parameters to prevent direct movement of fertilizer nutrients into our streams:

- Do not apply fertilizer if a heavy rain event is expected.
- Keep fertilizer away from drainage ditches, storm drains, or water. Maintain a 15-foot buffer from the banks of all waterways.
- Remove fertilizer that lands on impervious surfaces (driveways, sidewalks, roads, parking lots).

Working Together for Clean Water

With ever growing acres of managed turf in Pennsylvania, controlling what goes into PA waterways is ALL of our responsibility. Help protect Pennsylvania's waterways by being wise when you fertilize!
